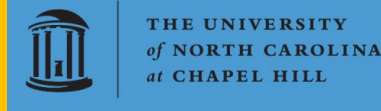


Through workshops, dialogue, stories and collegial gatherings, EMERGE is intended to:

## Monthly Virtual Workshops

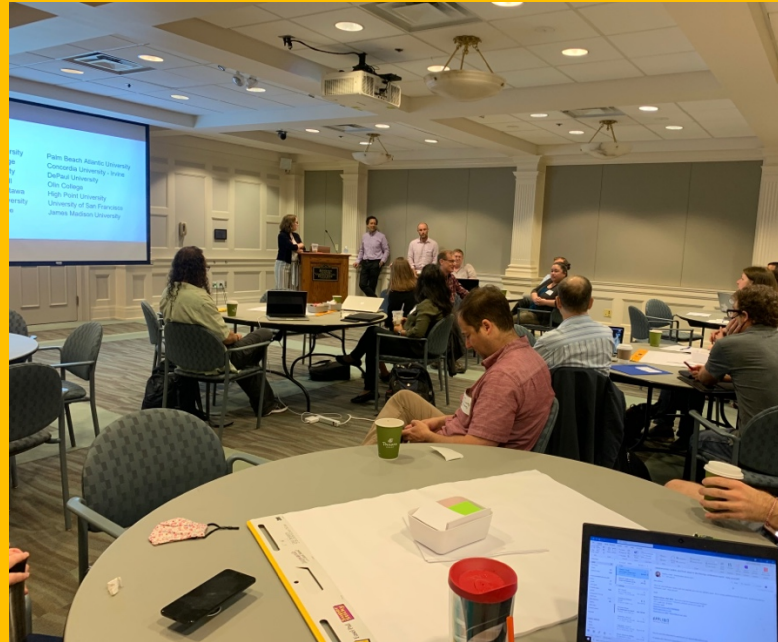
- 1 hour workshops, each month during semester
